

**ORDER ALLOWING LIMITED UNSEALING OF AFFIDAVITS
FOR THE PURPOSE OF COMPLYING WITH
DISCOVERY OBLIGATION UNDER RULE 16 OF FED. R. CRIM. P.,
AND FOR USE AT TRIAL**

On motion *ore tenus* by the United States in the above-captioned cause, for a limited unsealing of applications and affidavits for a search warrant and orders authorizing the interception of wire communications and a disc containing intercepted communications, filed under the number 3:07-MC-24, said limited unsealing being for the purpose of allowing the United States to comply with its discovery obligations under Rule 16 of the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure and for use at trial; and the Court being further fully advised on the premises finds that the said motion is well taken and should be sustained.

It is therefore ORDERED that the United States may disclose to counsel for all defendants the said applications, affidavits and disc of intercepted communications in order for the United States to comply with its obligations for discovery under Rule 16 of the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure, and for use at trial.

In all other respects the applications, affidavits and disc referred to herein shall remain sealed until further order of the Court.
